Please describe a summary of work undertaken by the SAC to improve student achievement and school performance.

The SAC has ongoing conversations about what is taking place at Atlantic View Elementary and possible future events. The input from the SAC is important in providing a community and parent lens for the work that takes place at our school. An area of focus continues to be on fostering inclusive and equitable learning opportunities for all students and creating diverse experiences for students that allow academic growth and a positive sense of self and well being. The SAC continues to support the purchase of school supplies for all students. This is valued by our families and allows teaching staff to move forward with their teaching of the literacy and math curriculum by ensuring the materials and resources are readily available to all students.

1. SSP Goals

<u>Literacy & Math</u>: Conversations about what is happening for staff professional learning as well as general conversation about the learning progression for students occurs at each meeting. Areas of focus this year was writing and math fluency. Our school, HRCE and Provincial Assessment results for Grade 3 (May 2024) and Grade 6 (October 2024) were reviewed.

<u>Well Being:</u> The area of focus this year was supporting students with problem solving strategies including recognizing the size of a problem and how to use this lens to advocate appropriate responses and supports. A school wide approach was used to build common language used in all classrooms as well as similar age-appropriate visuals/posters. Our ongoing conversation at our

SAC Meetings contributed to our discussions with staff and how to implement practices to support students in this area.

This year we have continued to include special events and activities that relate to student interest and build community within our school. This includes activities that foster growth and understanding in the area of fine arts (theatre -improv) as well as culture. Our school offers a nutritional breakfast and recess snack programs with the support of volunteers and additional funding through Healthy Schools Grant.
