We will be continuing with the extended Breakfast Program and Recess Snack Program this year. Recess snacks will start the week of September 8th, and the morning pancake and muffin program will start the week of September 15th. If you are interested in helping out with this, you can....

- Take and Bake Kits (premeasured ingredients). Picking up a **Muffin Kit** at the school and bake muffins at home and then return them to the school to freeze....and collect another muffin kit. These are set up to be quick and easy for you.
- 2. Picking up **Pancake Mix** at the school and making pancakes at home and then returning them to the school to freeze.
- 3. Cutting up **Fruits or Vegetables** at the school for serving during our recesses. (Each class received this one day per week)
- 4. Making **Smoothies** to serve at recess on Tuesday.

School Milk Program

The school milk program provides 237ml cartons of milk to students for **\$0.40**. Milk Tickets can be purchased as sheets of 10 for \$4.00. Please send exact change as the classroom teachers do not have a means to provide change.

Tickets are then redeemed for milk on a daily basis at the office. It is the parents responsibility to send a milk ticket with their child on the days that they would like milk. **Milk is now available.**

Volunteering at Atlantic View

Looking to participate in the school community? There are several ways that you can be involved as a volunteer at Atlantic View. You can be a chaperone on a field trip, assist with the breakfast program, be a volunteer reader with students.

In accordance with HRCE's Student Protection Policy, prior to volunteering with the Halifax Regional Centre for Education, all volunteers will provide:

- 1. A completed Child Abuse Register Child Abuse Register Search
- A certified and true copy of a Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector-Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector Search or by applying through the local RCMP/HRP. If you chose to go to a local detachment, please contact the school to receive a letter identifying you as a school volunteer as this will be required for the Vulnerable Sector Search.

Child Abuse Register Search and Criminal Records Check must be issued within the three months preceding volunteering and updated every three years. These forms do take time to get processed so it is important to get them completed in a timely manner and prior to volunteering. Please contact the office if you need financial assistance to complete this process or have any questions.

All students are covered during school hours and school activities under the Basic Plan.

The optional Gold Plan extends coverage for your child outside of school hours and school activities, around the
